Harris County 3 Amen -

I William A McDonald Sr
of said County and State, being of ad-
vanced age, but of sound and disposing
mind and memory, do make this my
last Will and Testament.

Item 1st - I desire that after my death that my
body be buried in a decent and
Christian-like manner at Kettle Creek
Cemetery in said County, and that after
the payment of the expenses attending the
same, and after the payment of all my
just debts, I direct that all of my property
descend as herein after stated.

Item Second - I give bequeath and devise to my wife
Rebecca McDonald, in fee simple, all of
the property both real and personal of
every character and description whatever of
which I may die seized or possessed.

Item Third - It is my will that the Executors herein
appointed shall not as required by law
make annual returns to the Court of
Ordinary, but shall make returns at
such times as they may see proper.

Item Fourth - It is my will and desire that my
said wife in her individual capacity or
my said Executors hereinafter named,
if necessary, to sell or dispose of any of
my property, both real and personal, either
at public or private sale as they may
deem proper, it shall not be required of
them to make application to the Ordinary
of said County or other authority for
an order so to do, and they shall not be
required to advertise the same or to do
or perform any other statutory require-
ments as a prerequisite to the sale of my

Item Fifth - I hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Rebecca McDonald, Executor and my son John B McDonald Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

Item Sixth - As I executed on the 1st day of June in the Year 1880, a trust deed for the benefit of my wife and minor children to E H Lewis and James McDonald, the same being of record in book of deeds, B. pages 416 & 417 and 418 in the Clerk's Office of the Superior Court of Ware County, I desire in Explanation thereof to say this, that deed was made before Mary Ann McDonald afterwards Mary Ann Sweet and Leatherine O McDonald afterwards Leatherine O Durham, were married and while they were minors. After the marriage of my said daughter Mary Ann to C M Sweet I delivered to her, her share of the stock cattle sheep and horse and Kitchen furniture named in said deed and to my daughter Leatherine O, she has received, since her marriage, under said deed, her portion of the household and Kitchen furniture and in lieu of all her interest named in said deed I Contemplate Convey to her lot of land number Two Hundred and twenty six (226) in the eighth (8) District of Ware County, Containing four Hundred and ninety acres, more or less, which if I do before my death, and she accepts the same it will be in full payment of all of her rights under said trust deed. This seventh day of February (1894) Eighteen hundred and ninety four.
