description after the payment of all just debts against me be kept together

if she remain a widow otherwise until the time of her marriage to be
used for her support and for the support rearing and education of my
children and at her death or in case of her marriage it is my will that
said estate be then divided between my said wife and children and
equal share to each.

It is my Will and desire that my executor herein after named

of my estate and also a lot of land belonging to me in Sumptner
