

In the name of God, Amen— I, Amy Wright, of the State
of Georgia and Warren County, considering the uncertainty of this mortal
life, and being of sound and perfect mind and memory, (I do) full heartily
God for the same, do make and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following, (that is to say), First, I commend my
soul to Almighty God, and desire that my body may be decently buried.
Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Rachel Wright
all my estate in Warren County, both Real and Personal, during her
life, or widowhood; if my Wife marry, it is my will and desire
that all my estate in the County above mentioned (except my Land)
be immediately divided among those my children mentioned in this
will, (to wit) Eliza, David, Lewis, Joseph, Amy, James, Lucy,
Oler and Dismall, except one third, or a Child's part, which my
Wife may choose to take— Thirdly, I give and bequeath all my
Land in Warren County unto my sons David, Joseph, Amy, &
James, which is to be equally divided among them at the
death of my Wife, and not before— Fourthly, I give and
bequeath unto my grandson Lewis, my son David's son, enough to give
him a liberal education and to him of his own
estate, (to wit) I give and bequeath unto my son David, at my
death, all the land that my Land is to me in County, at my
death, and I give and bequeath unto all my children, except
my Wife, my estate in the County, I give and bequeath unto my
son David, my son Joseph, my son Lewis, my son James,
my son Oler, my son Dismall, and my son Amy, that my grandson
Lewis, my son David's son, be entitled to the estate given to
him in this will, when he comes of age by Law.
I, Amy Wright, do hereby declare and acknowledge
this to be my last will and testament, revoking all former
wills and Dispositions whatsoever. In witness whereof,

buried in decent Christian burial at the direction of my Executors,
nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching
such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in
this life, I give, demise and dispose of the same, in the following
manner and form: To wit, I give and bequeath to my dearly
beloved wife, Mary the Land and Plantation whereon I now
live, together with my stock, Horses, Hogs and Cattle, working
tools, Kitchens, furniture, during her natural life
or Widow-hood, with full power to sell and dispose of parts
of the same, the Residue excepted before may be at her death
I have by my last Will devised, devised and in that case it may
be that I should take in hand, but I will that during her
life, at her death the same I give, I give, together with
what I shall receive in my name in the month of October
to be paid and divided among my four children, to wit, Mary,
James, John, and John, the said Mary, James, and John,
as received a share, Mary my second daughter, two hundred dollars,
James my second son, two hundred dollars, John has received
two hundred dollars, John has not received any thing, and it is
my will that my son John should receive a equal share, together
with my share of possession, and also my son John, when coming
of age should receive a equal share with the rest of my children, what
I shall receive of my first and second children I should all have an
equal share, my estate, both real and personal, wanting in the
the three parts as already said. And I do hereby constitute
and appoint my dearly beloved wife, Mary, and my son, John
to be Executors of this my last will and Testament, to wit, to
do as I have bequeathed to my heirs and to all this 24th day
