The last will & Testament of Mrs. Ann F. Muncrief, dec^d.

Georgia, In the name of God amen.

Warren County.

I Ann F. Muncrief, of said
county of Warren, being of sound mind and dying memory, but weak in
body, taking into consideration the uncertainty of life, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void
all former wills either made or purporting to be made by me, at any time
and First I commend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my mortal
remains to the earth in decent burial, and do direct that my body shall be
interred by the side of and in such manner as was that of my late husband,
also that a tablet similar in form to that marks his grave be erected over my
remains and that they be both enclosed in such manner as his my said husband's
grave. And to such worldly estate as I am possessed of and entitled to, I dispose
of the same as follows.

First I direct that all my debts & funeral expenses be paid as soon after
my decease as is possible out of any monies that shall come into the
hands of my Executor from any portion of my estate real or personal.

Second, To my niece Mary Ann Lockhart, wife of Henry Lockhart I give
and bequeath the following property viz. One Negro woman named Peggy, one
negro woman named Mary with her future increase. My new carriage with
skins thereunto pertaining and all the furniture which I may leave in the
house of Geo^t Henry Lockhart, also one pair of silver candlesticks,
one silver tray and Snuffers and three china flower vases.

Third, To my niece Mary Ann Young wife of Edward Young I give
and bequeath the five negroes which are in the possession of the said
Edward Young to wit: Sarah a negro woman, Martha a negro woman,
Brawford a negro boy, Melmond a negro boy and Kitty a girl child.

also one half pint silver cup, one pair silver candlesticks and one silver punch ladle.

^{www.georgiapioneers.com} To my niece Susan B. Billups wife of John Billups I give and bequeath one set silver table spoons and one silver pepper castor.

Fifth. To my niece Elizabeth B. Billups, wife of Robert Billups I give and bequeath one set silver table spoons and one silver pepper castor.

Sixth. To my niece Ellen A. Young, wife of William Young, I give and bequeath one dozen silver desert spoons, one punch ladle and pair sugar tongs.

Seventh. To my niece Jane L. Gunby wife of Robert Gunby, I give and bequeath one large silver ladle, one dozen silver tea spoons and one salt spoon.

Eighth. To the following persons, children of Henry Lockhart & my niece Mary Lockhart, I give & bequeath individually the following property, to wit: To Rowena Malvina Lockhart, one yellow girl named Cammilla. To Ann E. Lockhart, one negro girl named Florotta. To Richard A. Lockhart, one negro boy named William Page. To Robert A. Lockhart, one negro boy named Van Buren. and to Mary Cornelia Lockhart & Ellen Jane Lockhart, I give & bequeath each the sum of six hundred dollars, to purchase for each a negro girl at such time as they may think proper. And I further direct that the requisitions contained in this with the seven clauses immediately preceding and also the bequests specified therein, be carried into effect by my Executor as soon after my death as conveniently may be.

Ninth. To my sister Ann Elizabeth Higdon, I bequeath the sum of four hundred dollars. To my niece Susan M. Billups, hereinbefore mentioned, I give the sum of one thousand dollars.

To my niece Elizabeth B. Billups, before mentioned, I give the sum of one thousand dollars. To my niece Ellen A. Young, before mentioned, I give the sum of eighteen hundred dollars. To my niece Jane L. Gunby, before mentioned, I give the sum of eighteen hundred ~~and~~ dollars.

To my niece Ann A. Young, before mentioned, I give the sum of three hundred dollars. To my niece Mary Ann Ely, wife of Charles A. Ely, I give the sum of three hundred dollars. To my niece Elizabeth Ellenor Oglesby, wife of Urban B. Oglesby, I give three hundred dollars.

To my niece Augusta Beall Smith, wife of Stoddard W. Smith, I give the sum of three hundred dollars. To my niece Mary Jane Shields wife of Matthew Shields, I give the sum of three hundred dollars.

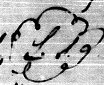

^{www.georgiapioneers.com} To Florid Beall, daughter of the late Robert A. Beall, I give the sum of six hundred dollars, and I do direct that the sums in this clause specified be paid by my Executor to the respective legatees.

in three equal annual installments the first payment to be made at the end of one year from my decease (except the sum bequeathed to Florida Beall which I will shall remain in the hands of my executor for the purpose of purchasing a negro girl for the said Florida when she shall require, provided such requirement shall not be made within one year from my death.) These said several sums of money to be made from the sale of my property or any part of it, not otherwise disposed of or advanced by my executor at his discretion.

Tenth. I do devise give & bequeath unto Henry Lockhart, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, all & singular, the lands & tenements of which I may die seized, possessed or entitled to, together with all my negroes & household furniture, stock &c, not otherwise provided for or disposed of, of which I may die possessed, and all and singular the rights & credits & all & every thing of which I may die possessed or entitled to subject to the payment of my debts as heretofore specified and to the payment of all and singular the legacies and bequests before mentioned. And I further bequeath to Henry Lockhart my gold watch, formerly my husbands, as a keepsake.

Eleventh. I do hereby constitute, make and ordain the said Henry Lockhart, sole executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I Ann F. Muncie of the Testatrix, have herunto set my hand & seal, this Third day of July, Eighteen hundred & forty. (1840)
