

Georgia Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852
 Warren County, Georgia Robert Fleming
 considering the shortness of life and certainty of death and being of sound
 mind and of disposing memory do make ordain and publish this as my last
 and only will and testament - in manner and form as follows -
 Item first - I give and bequeath after death - my spirit unto him who gave it,
 and my body to the grave in decent burial -
 Item 2^d - I give and bequeath unto my wife Cynthia Fleming - all that tract
 and parcel of land, lying upon the waters of Williams Creek, containing five
 hundred acres more or less - now known as my plantation adjoining lands
 of Lockett - Culpper and others - to have and to hold in her right - until my son
 Arthur shall arrive at the age of twenty one years of age - and at which time said
 tract of land together with all other real and personal estate - herein after granted
 and bequeathed - shall be equally distributed between my wife, Cynthia - and
 my son Arthur - and in case that my wife Cynthia shall die before my son
 Arthur - then all property, real and personal, herein bequeathed, shall descend
 to my son Arthur - to have and to hold to himself and heirs forever
 in fee simple, but if my son Arthur die before my wife Cynthia - either
 before or after he shall have arrived at the age of twenty one - then all
 property real and personal herein conveyed - shall vest in my wife Cynthia
 forever in fee simple.
 Item 3^d - I give and bequeath unto my wife Cynthia the following negroes
 to wit: Prid, Charles, Eben, George, Mervellen, Thordy, Aba, Tom, Louisa,
 Austin, Peter, Mary, Subject to the contingencies expressed in the second item
 of this my last will and testament.
 Item 4th - I hereby appoint and constitute my wife Cynthia Fleming,
 as sole executrix of this my last will and testament - and I thereby give
 her authority to dispose of the free negroes heretofore bound to me, as she
 may think proper - and I further give her authority to dispose of my inter-
 est in the house and lot in the town of Wamenton commonly known as
 the Eagle Tavern - as she may think proper -
 Item 5th - All other property not heretofore bequeathed in this will -
 both real and personal - to wit: horses, cattle, hogs - household and kitchen
 furniture - and all effects - chattels and inter-its - whatever - now belonging
 to me, I bequeath unto my wife Cynthia - Subject to the contingencies before
 mentioned in the second item of this will.
 In witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty
 seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine - (1839)
 Signed, Sealed, published and dec - Robert Fleming, (Sd)
 Witness the undersigned, J. P. [illegible]
 Fleming to be his last will and testament in the presence of us

who have hereto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the Testator,

Will of Micajah Rogers, died.

State of Georgia, Warren County.

In the name of God Amen. I Micajah Rogers, of the County aforesaid, do make
this my last will & Testament in manner and form following, to wit, To God I
return sin and who gave it, and my body to The Earth in decent burial
And for my temporal goods. I First, I give my beloved wife Martha the three
tracts of land Sharon & now live granted to Gible, Toward and Plauden Negroes
Pete, Samons, & Maria, and her four children, Randolph, child of Pete, one
one year provisions for herself, family and stock - Mules Pete, Rock, mare Sam-
cary & her young at last and The Samita mare. Five first choice cows, & calves. Five
best hogs & pigs. Five good does, and a due proportion of any other live stock. The piano
to remain in her possession for the three youngest children when they come of age.
That she is to have during her life or widowhood and the worth to raise and
educate my three youngest children. And at her death to be equally divided
between all my children - My grandson Micajah Wilson to receive no part of it.
I wish all the balance of my estate, whether consisting of land, negroes, stock
debts due to - all turned into money and equally divided between my wife and all
my children, share and share alike My wife to have the use of that part that falls
to her during her life. My grandson Micajah Wilson to receive no part.

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In the name of God Amen.

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I, Ann Catharine Zuisenby of the State of Georgia, and county Warren, do make, constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1 I will that all my debts be paid in any way that my executor may deem most proper.

Item 2 I will that my negro girl Jane and her increase if any she may have to my father James Zuisenby, during his natural life, and at his death to go to my brother James Lewis Zuisenby by this my last will and Testament.

Item 3 I hereby appoint Seaborn Dozier my Executor to this my last will and Testament.
