

Georgia, In the name of God Amen.

Warren County Georgia Wills 1828-1852 of the county & state aforesaid, being in
perfect health of body & of perfect mind & memory and well knowing that it is
appointed unto man once to die, do make and ordain this my last will &
testament. I will my soul to God my Creator trusting in the merits of a merciful
Redeemer, that it will be received into a state of never ending happiness and my
body, I give to the earth to be buried in such decent and Christian like manner, as to
my executors hereafter named, shall seem most proper, and touching such worldly
goods wherewith it has pleased God to bless me, I give will and dispose thereof, in
the manner and form following to wit: 1st I give & bequeath unto my loving wife
Rhoda Geesling for & during her natural life or widowhood, the house and five acres of
land immediately around it where my son Fleming now lives & as much timber as will
be sufficient to keep up said premises in rails, boards, firwood, &c &c and if she
thinks proper to have the privilege of using water out of the well in the yard where I
now live, and also one bed, bedstead & bed furniture, and a negro woman by the name
of Grace - My executors will furnish her annually with forty bushels of corn, twenty
pounds of sugar (brown) & ten pounds of coffee.

2nd I give & devise unto my son Fleming Geesling, the tract of land, whereon it
now lies containing two hundred & fifty acres reserving out of said tract the five
acres, which has been given to my wife during her natural life or widowhood. Also
give to him a negro boy by the name of Dick -

3rd I give & devise unto my son Benjamin Geesling, a negro boy by the name of Sam -
4th I give & devise unto my daughter Mahala Geesling a negro woman by the name of
Harriett & a negro boy by the name of Hiram, one bed, bedstead & bed furniture -

5th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Geesling, a negro boy named
Stephen & a girl by the name of Sizz, one Bed, bedstead & bed furniture -

6th It is my will that my negro man Phil be sold to the highest bidder & the
proceeds paid over to my daughter Nancy Duggin. I wish it expressly understood
by my executors that the purchaser of Phil shall not carry him out of the
neighborhood of his wife.

7th I will the balance of my estate be sold and the proceeds be divided
equally between my wife, children & grand children, Share & share alike to wit:
The children of my daughter Priscilla, to have one share; The children of my
Daughter Petsey to have one share. The children of my son Hiram to have one share
Nancy Duggin to have one share. Benjamin Geesling one share. Mahala Geesling
one share. Fleming Geesling one share. Mary Geesling one share & my wife
Rhoda Geesling one share. Lastly, I hereby appoint my sons Benjamin &
Fleming Geesling executors of my last will & testament revoking & void all
and every other will or wills by me made, published or declared. In testimony whereof,
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 20th December 1858.

The last will & Testament of Jeremiah Butt, dec^o.

In the name of God amen.

Jeremiah Butt, senior, being in
tuble health, but of a sound mind and disposing memory, knowing
the certainty of death do make this my last will and Testament.
I command my soul to God who gave it.

I will that my body be interred decently near my wife and children
at the church burial ground, around the graves I wish a stone wall
to be erected by my executors in a suitable manner.

I will that all my estate both personal and real be sold publicly
to the highest bidder at such time as my executor shall think
best, hiring and renting the property in the best possible manner
until it is disposed of by sale.

I will that all my just debts be paid and if my son
Edmund W. Butt's estate after being examined into by my
executor should fail to pay his just debts that they
shall be paid out of my estate.
