The last will & Testament of Benjamin Harrison deceased.

Given under my hand to whom these presents may concern know ye that Warren County, Benjamin Harrison of the State and County aforesaid, being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

1st. I will that all my just debts be paid.

2nd. I will to wife Abigail Harrison during her natural life,

the plantation whereon I now live together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging the tract of land contains seventy five acres more or less, all my stock of horses, hogs sheep goats &c. three cows and calves, Waggon and gear all my plantation tools, house hold and kitchen furniture, also the privilege of timber off of one other certain tract of land conveyed to me by Wm. Ansley for the necessary use of this place for fencing or building, or for repairing either fence or houses.

3rd. I will to son Benjamin Harrison fifty acres of land, to be laid off the above Wm. Ansley tract on the end or side next adjoining Morris Ansley and Stanford's Land and bound east by Wilson, also one bed bed stid and furniture,

4th. I will to daughter Elizabeth Harrison fifty acres of land to be laid off on the south side of the fifty acres willed to my son Benjamin that is also a part of the said Wm. Ansley tract also one bed stid and furniture.

5th. I will to son John C. Harrison the balance of the Wm. Ansley tract of land, also another piece of ^{land of} thirty seven acres more or less adjoining Lazenby, Ivy and Wilson, also one bed stid and furniture. And after the death of my wife Abigail Harrison, the place or tract of land whereon I now live also one bed stid and furniture.

6th. I will that my tract of land now in Upson County drawn by Mary Moran, widow Williams Dist. Warren County, known at the time of drawing by the number ninety five sixteenth Dist. Houston County, be run off into four equal lots the dividing line to commence on the line dividing the said tract from number ninety six and crossing little potatoe creek direct to number ninety four, the said division not to be made until after the sum of three hundred dollars is raised from the rent of the said land, or paid to my executor or executors for the use and benefit of David George Cooper, by the persons to be interested in the said land, then and after that the said land to be divided as above.

written the one fourth part of said
tract of land in Upson County, that lies next or adjoining
the number ninety two.

8. I will to my daughter Mary Smith and to the heirs of her
body the next one fourth part.

9. I will to daughter Nancy Ausley the next one fourth part.

10. I will to my daughter Rebecca Ausley the remaining part
which lies next the No. one hundred and twenty eight.

Know all men by these presents James Ausley my son in law, and husband of my
daughter Rebecca, rented a part of the said tract of land in
Upson County for the year 1831 and moved to the same,
where he remained the year 1832 for which last year of 1832,
he the said James has not given any satisfaction for rent,
and has not as yet made any application to me for terms
of rent, for the present year, I therefore will that my executor
or executors raise and collect from him the said James Ausley
the sum of sixty dollars for rent for the year 1832, and also
sixty dollars for the present year, and sixty dollars for each
and every year he may stay hereafter on said land
and not to execute to him the said James any title or cause
to be executed to him until he complies with this my last will
and testament unless he the said James pays the same to me
and has my receipt for the same.

11. I will that after the death of my wife the property then
left of whatsoever it may be to equally divided amongst my child
12th lastly I do hereby appoint my son in law Abel Ausley
and William Garrison, executors to this my last will and
testament In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand and
affix my seal this 19th January 1833. Benjamin Harrison, L.S.
