In the name of God Amen

I Barnard N. Franklin of the County aforesaid
being in full health but of senile and
disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty
of human life and the certainty of death - and being desirous
of making some disposition of my worldly affairs with
which it has pleased God to bless me, while I have strength
and capacity to do so, Do hereby publish and declare this to be
my last will and Testament, hereby recalling all other last
wills and Testament which I may have made, and
first I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body
to the earth in decent burial

Second, My will is that all my just debts be paid by my
executors hereinafter appointed as soon after my decease
as ~~possible~~ ^{practicable} for said Decemint,

Item 1st I give unto my grand daughter Adeline Gibbons
four hundred dollars in cash,

Item 2nd I give unto my grand daughter Ellen Synak my
gold watch which I now wear.

Item 3rd I give unto the children of Thomas J. and
Carline Wheeler each two hundred dollars.

Item 4th My will is that the balance of my estate
real and personal and unincumbered be divided by my executors
into three equal parts or ~~quarters~~ ^{quarters}, the one third I give
to my daughter Adeline Synak, wife of Dr Edward S.
Synak for her sole and separate use free from the
contracts, debts, or liabilities of her present or future

Husband to the said ~~Adeline~~ The said Edward J. Lynch in trust
for her use, and at the death of the said Adeline my
direction is that the one third and its proffits and
increase shall go to the children of the said Adeline
thru in life, and to vest in them for their separate
use free from the contracts or liabilities of their
Husband)

Item 5th The second portion or one third part I give
unto the children of Mingfird and Emeline Wright (The
later deceased) for their sole and separate use

Item 6th The remaining portion or one third part I
give unto the children of Henry ~~and~~ Eliza Gilman
(The later now deceased) to their sole and separate use
free from the controll use and benefit of the present
or future husband of any of them, or free from the
Controll use and benefit of their Father,

Item 8th I give unto Dr Augustus C. Rogers in trust
for his wife Rebecca one hundred dollars in cash

Item 7th I nominate constitute and appoint my
friends Thomas P. F. Thomas and Archibald W. Jackson
Executors to this my last will and Testament contained
in this sheet of paper and to which I have subscribed
my name and affixed my seal in this fourteenth day
of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and fifty and

The foregoing last will and Testament of Barnard
W. Jackson contained in the last sheet of paper
was signed sealed published and declared by him
as his last will and Testament, in the presence

Item 8th was inserted in the original will between
Items 5th and 6th and was interlined before signing
The word hundred in Item 8th was interlined by

Warren County. I Barnard W. Fickling of the State and County
aforesaid, having made and executed my last will & Testament
bearing date June 14th 1851 - and being desirous of
making some alterations in the same do hereby make
and publish the following to be the codicil to my last
will and Testament,

First, I revoke so much of them 4th in my said will
in relation to the distribution of the balance of my
estate real and personal and mixed. And now desire
that the same shall stand - and be considered as a part
of the whole with the following exception to-wit -

I give unto my grand daughter Ellen Synak one half
share of my silver desert spoons to her own separate use

2^d, I give unto my grand son James Wright son of
Mingfield Wright my negro boy named Sam about
seven years of age to his own separate use - without the
aforesaid alterations there is no other matter or
thing, which I desire to have altered or revoked
in my said last will and Testament, and I hereby
ratify and confirm the same. Witness my hand
and seal on this first day of July in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and
signed sealed published and declared

as my last will and testament,

both real and personal and after the payment of my
just debts the proceeds thereof to be divided into seven
equal ~~parts~~ shares and to be distributed as follows
To wit, I will and bequeath to my sons Benjamin
Thompson Stephen Thompson Nathaniel Thompson
Belo Thompson and Polkilo Thompson each and
share and share alike and to James S. Thompson
and John B. Thompson children of my son John
Thompson and share and I further give and bequeath
to my son Belo Thompson, as first in the remaining
share of my estate to wit one seventh part thereof
in trust to and for the support and benefit of my
daughter Mary Gibson during her life free and
exempt from the claims and rights of her
husband and on her decease to be equally divided
