Georgia, In the name of God Amen.
 Warren County, I Clement Wymme of the State and County aforesaid
 being in a low state of health, but of good and sound mind
 and memory and knowing also, that all men must die and I
 have thought proper to make the following to be my last Will and
 Testament, in the manner and form following—
 Item, first, I give my soul to the God who made me and my
 body to my executor to be buried in form and manner as
 he shall think proper, best. —
 2nd It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid
 by my executor —
 3rd I give to my sister Mary Johnson one Negro man named Jeffery
 and two hundred dollars —
 4th I give to my Niece Susan Morris, one ^{negro} girl Malinda —
 5th I give to Frances Adkins, one negro girl named Sally —
 6th I give to Louisa Wymme, daughter of James Wymme, one negro girl
 named Rose —
 7th I give to Albert Wymme, Son of James Wymme, one negro boy
 named Bill —
 8th I give to Abner Wymme, Son of James Wymme, one negro
 girl named Caroline —
 9th I give to Loker Ann Wymme, daughter of James Wymme, one
 negro girl, named Martha —

I give to Elizabeth Wynne, daughter of James Wynne, one negro woman named Nancy and her child Nancy -

11th I give to Elizabeth Wynne, daughter of James Wynne, one negro girl, by the name of Amildred, which is raised from the ninth item -

12th I give to my Brothers James Wynne, Joby Wynne, Elemeul Wynne, Robert Wynne and my Sister Elizabeth Gunn, all of my money, notes, and accounts of every description, to be equally divided between them, share and share alike and also for those in the last item to have all and any other species of property that I have which is not named in any of the above items -

13th and lastly I do hereby constitute and ordain my brother James Wynne to be my Executor to this my last will and testament. Revoking all other wills or testaments that I may have made at any other time heretofore - In testimony of the foregoing I have hereunto set my name and caused my seal to be affixed this the fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fortythree. -
