

Georgia. In the name of God amen!!!
 Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1855
 David McCoy of the State and county aforesaid,
 being feeble in body, but of a well disposing mind & memory
 knowing that it is appointed unto man once to die, have
 thought proper to make this my last Will and Testament.
 I commend my Spirit to God who gave it me. My body to be buried
 in a decent manner

Item 1st. After my burial expenses, It is my will that all my
 just debts be first paid.

Item 2nd. It is my will that each of my daughters that I have not
 already given, have a bed and furniture & bridle & Saddle.

Item 3rd. It is my will that the negroes I lent to my daughters Martha
 Brooks, and Rebecca Harbuck, be brought back and all my
 negroes be divided into eight equal shares, one eighth part or share
 I lend to Martha Brooks during her ^{life}, then to be equally divided between
 the lawful issues of her body. Another Eighth part I lend to Rebecca
 Harbuck during her natural life then to be divided between the issues
 of her body. Another Eighth part I give to my grand children,
 Martha Ann and Alphens Brooks to be equally divided between them.
 If either of them should die without issue the other to have all
 If both should thus die it shall revert back to my Estate to be equally
 divided as the rest of my property is divided by this will.

Item 4th. I give the other five (5) parts to my children, David, Sarah,
 Caroline, Eliza and Frances if either of them should die without
 a lawful issue from their body it shall be divided between the
 remaining four.

Item 5th. It is my will that all my property (except the negroes and
 that already named) and lands that I may die seized and possessed
 of be sold and divided in the same manner and with restrictions
 as the negroes and to be divided in the same manner.

I hereby appoint my children David and Sarah McCoy and
 Samuel Hall to carry this my last Will and Testament into effect.
 I hereby revoke and disannul all others whatsoever

Signed and sealed on the Eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and forty. (1840)
