Item Second: I bequeath to my beloved Sister, Martha Sammons, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the County and State aforesaid, on the waters of Middle Creek, adjoining lands of Thompson Mays and others, near the Georgia Railroad, and on the north side of said Road, containing about thirty acres, more or less.
