In the name of God amen. I Esther J. Wright of said State and County, being of advanced age, and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world, deem it right and proper, both as respects myself and my family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed. I therefore make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and unnulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item first. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and a Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances, and my soul, I trust, shall return to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope <sup>for</sup> eternal salvation the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, whose religion I have professed, and I humbly trust, enjoyed for a number of years.

Item second; I bequeath to my beloved Sister, Martha Sammons, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the County and State aforesaid, on the waters of Middle Creek, adjoining lands of Thompson & May, and others, near the Georgia Railroad, and on the north side of said Road, containing about thirty acres, more or less.
