Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my nephew, Dr. W. A. Clark
one third part, of all my heritable property, that is to say, of the
remaining field not exceeding 100 acres.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my wife Anna, my share

and one half of all my heritable property, that is to say,

of my brother, James, the one & one hundred &

my heritable property, to be equally divided amongst them, Isaac

Hancock, Jr. or any legitimate issue living, he is an

adult, & his son, Isaac, Anna and Martha, & should any

of the above die before all the individuals above named,

with a hundred acres, those individuals remaining, being three

hundred & eight acres, more or less.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Lee and the heirs

of her body, John, George, William, Anna and Martha,

sixthly, I give and bequeath unto Little John, Lee, the heirs

of his body, John, George, William, Anna and Martha.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate & appoint Doctor

Isaac, my true & faithful attorney to this my last Will & Testament
