are held and firmly bound unto Septimus Weatherly Register
Probate for said County, (or Successors in Office), in the sum
of five thousand dollars, for the true payment of which we
bindours our heirs &c. in the sum aforesaid as Witness our
hands this 9th day of February 1797.

The condition of the above obligation is Such, that if
above bounden George Franklin Adm^r of the Goods and Chas
& Articles of William Franklin late of this County does and
make a true and perfect Inventory of all the Goods & Chattels
Credits of the dec^d. which have, or shall come to the Ea^r
possession or knowledge of the said George Franklin, or into the
possession of any other person for him, and the same as he
do exhibit into the said Court of Wacon, when he shall be
unto required, & such Goods, Chattels and Credits do well &
truly administer according to law, and do make a just &
true account of his acting and doings therein when required
The Sup^r. Court, or Register of Probate for the County &
the rest of the goods, Chattels and credits which shall be found
remaining on account of S^d. Administration, the same be
allowed by the S^d. Court. I shall deliver and pay to such persons
as shall be entitled to the same by Law. And if it shall
hereafter appear that any last Will or Testament was made
by the S^d. dec^d. & the same be proved before the Court of the County
obtain a certificate thereof the prob^t. thereof & the S^d. George
Franklin do in such case in due diligence the S^d. Court
of Administration then the obligation to be void, & the
same in full force & virtue.
