I George M. Huff of Warren County and State of Georgia, being of sound mind Memory, taking into mind the shortness of this life, together with the uncertainty of the same, do make and ordain this my last will & testament disposing of myself and these earthly effects with which it has pleased Almighty God to bless me; in the following manner, namely:

In the first place I give my signature ^{the hands of} God who gave it and my body to be buried in a decent Christian-like manner according to the discretion of my friends.

2nd
After the payment of my just debts which I direct to be done by Executor, selling the following negroes, to wit Daniel and his wife, Jane and his child Malley, and if the proceeds of the sale of the above mentioned negroes is not sufficient to pay my just debts, then my Executor will proceed to sell so much of my property as can be best spared for the settlement of my debts. I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Unity Huff all my estate both real and personal except one Negro Girl named Frances, during her natural life.

3rd
I give & bequeath to my beloved son Jonathan J. Huff the sum of two hundred dollars.

4th
I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Huff ^{my body} and one negro girl Frances - and it is further my will that my property ^{all} be left to her after paying the expenses of keeping her in the plantation, the proceeds of the place to be paid over to my beloved wife Unity Huff to be disposed of by her

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as she may see proper, and after the death of my beloved wife
 which may be left be equally divided
 among all my children and I appoint Jonathan J. G. Huff
 my Executor.

 thousand eight hundred and fifty.
