Wills and Testament of George Turner, deceased. 1842.

State of Georgia; In the presence of Almighty God, I George Turner, of the State and Warren County, County aforesaid, being of a sound and disposing mind, do make this my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke all former wills. And I do hereby appoint and constitute my Son Nathan Turner, and my two Sons-in-Law, John T. Carr and Robert W. Hubert, executors to this my last will and Testament. At my death first & principally I resign my soul into the keeping of it, and my body into the hands of my executors, to be decently buried. — And as respects such worldly Estate, as it hath pleased the Almighty to give to and entrust me with: I give and bequeath the same in the following manner, viz:

First, I will that all my just debts be paid.

Second, I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Harriett, that my plantation consisting of six hundred acres of land more or less, in the State and county aforesaid, together with the household, kitchen furniture and farming utensils, also all my stock, consisting of horses, hogs, cattle, sheep &c. Also a negro man named Jacob, a woman Nancy and a girl Rebecca, her lifetime. —

Thirdly, I will and bequeath to my Son Warren a negro girl named Martha, to make him have an equal portion of property with the rest of my children. —

Fourthly, I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy a negro girl named Adeline, to make her have also an equal portion. —

Now I consider that all my children have had an equal portion of my property.

Fifthly, After which I will the balance of my property to be divided into eight equal parts, which I will and bequeath in the following manner, viz:

First, I will and bequeath one part to my beloved wife, Harriett. —

2^d I will and bequeath one part to the children of my daughter Lucy, dec'd. —

3^d I will and bequeath one part to my Son Nathan. —

4th. I will and bequeath one part to the children of my daughter Martha, dec'd. —

5th. I will and bequeath one part to my Son Warren. —

6th. I will and bequeath one part to my daughter Mary. —

7th. I will and bequeath one part to the heirs of my Son George. —

8th and lastly, I will and bequeath one part to my daughter Nancy. —

Sixthly, The property which I herein bequeath to my beloved Wife, Harriett, at her death I will equally, to be divided between my heirs.

Lastly, The beforementioned distribution consumes the whole of my Estate.
