I give and bequeath to my beloved son Thomas Coker, one tract or parcel of land, which he now owns, containing by estimation one hundred, eighty eight, and an half acres, he the said son, and his one other tract in Warren County adjoining, purchased by me of Dr. Jonathan Lemmon, containing one hundred acres, he the son, and his one Negro fellow named Tom, one Negro son Thomas, one Negro woman Mary, and her two children, Elizabeth and Mary, but in addition in increase, also two of my Negroes of which being of my Negroes and four other Negroes to him, his heirs and assigns forever. I give and bequeath to my beloved son Elizabeth Coker, one tract or parcel of land in which I now live, containing by estimation five hundred and fifty acres, also one other tract by estimation of two thousand and fifty acres, purchased of Robert Carey also one tract estimated at one hundred acres, purchased of Dr. Jonathan Lemmon, all adjoining each other,
