I know wherefore I may concern that I Isaac Hart, Senior, of the State & County aforesaid, being weak & infirm of body but of sound mind & disposing memory & knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die & after this the judgment; do make this my last will & Testament, as follows to wit, & first I give my soul to God that gave it me, my body to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial not doubting but that I shall receive the same reunited at the great & dreadfull day of Judgement. & as touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with, in this life, I want the same disposed of in the following manner to wit.

1st It is my desire that each of my daughters, namely Sarah Addkins, Philbe Pablis, Mary Hobbs, Milby Hobbs, & Elizabeth Carry & their heirs keep & have the negro girls & their increase that I have already given them, upon this that is my daughters marriage, & which they now have in possession.

2nd I give & bequeath unto each of my daughters to wit Sarah Addkins, Philbe Pablis, Mary Hobbs, Milby Hobbs, & Elizabeth Carry & their

heirs, the sum of one hundred dollars each, to be paid to them by my Executors, hereafter to be named said money to be paid out of my Estate.

3rd I give & bequeath unto my son Samuel Hart & his heirs one half of a tract of land containing together two hundred & fifty acres more or less, said land was purchased by me at publice sale of the Estate of Solomon Givson, deceased, the dividing line to be run from North to South parallel with the original line of S. tract & Samuel Hart to have the west end which joins his land where he now lives.

4th I give & bequeath to my son Barnabas Hart & his heirs seven hundred dollars, six hundred of which is paid, the remaining hundred to be paid to him by my Executors.

5th I give & bequeath to my son Isaac Hart & his heirs seven hundred dollars, all of which is already paid.

6th I give & bequeath to my son William Hart & his heirs one tract of land (lying on the North side of the above mentioned two hundred & fifty acre tract) containing two hundred & seventy six acres more or less, conveyed to me by deed from Wiley Givson, also one bed & furniture, & also one hundred dollars to be paid to him out of my Estate by my Executors.

7th I give & bequeath to my son Vincent Hart & his heirs seven hundred dollars to be paid to him by my Executors out of my Estate, also one bed & furniture & two cows & calved.

9. It is my desire that all of my property both real & personal not
mentioned in this will be by my Executors equally divided
among all my children & their heirs to wit, Sarah Addkins, Rebekah
Pebbles, Mary Hobbs, Milby Hobbs, Elizabeth Parry, Damuel Hart,
Samuel Hart, Isaac Hart, William Hart, Vincent & Solomon Hart.
10. I do hereby constitute & appoint Aaron Addkins my counsellor &
my son Isaac Hart my Executor of this my last Will & Testament
to execute the same at their discretion attending to the tenor & language
thereof & I do hereby revoke all other wills heretofore made by me; as
witness my hand & seal, this 2^d day of January 1838.
