

Georgia. To all to whom these presents may concern.

I Warren C. Smith, do make, Jacob Smith of the state and county aforesaid, being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament, and hereby revoking any and all others heretofore made, I set I will that all my just debts be paid.

2^d. I will unto my wife Christian Smith during her natural or widowhood five negroes (viz) David, Burnel, Duda, Rebecca and Rose. The plantation wheron I now live, with the woodland land thereunto belonging, the land and plantation is considered to be on the south side of a branch running between me and where Sam Smith now lives and up said branch to the fork, thence a strait line to a pine corner on the west line, my waggon, one still, one eight day clock, stock of all and every kind plantation tools of all and description, all my household and kitchen furniture, and my Blacksmith Tools.

3^d. I will to my grand children Martha Peter, Mary Fair, Cynthia Fair, Rebecca Fair, and Jacob Fair, all that part of a tract of land which I purchased of Isaac Davidson, that lies on the west side of a branch of Childress Creek, which runs through said tract, also on other tract joining the other purchased of Rubin McGee containing 350 acres, which said land I will my daughter Catherine the mother of said children to have the use of during her life for her support in such way as my executors may think best.

4th. I will to my daughter Martha Johnston the tract of land where she now lives containing 262 acres, also after the death of my wife Christian Smith two negroes (viz) David and Duda.

5th. I will to my grandson Vinson Smith one certain piece of land joining where I now live and lying on the west side of Oliver's Creek and on the north side of the branch named in the second up said branch to the fork thence a strait line to a pine corner on the west line.

6th. I will to grandson Hillmon Smith all the land down on the east side of Oliver's Creek, also to Vinson and Hillmon aforesaid the balance of the tract of land purchased of Isaac Davidson (viz) all of said tract on the east side of a branch running through the same to be equally divided between them.

7th. I will that my negro man Collin be sold to the man he may chose for a master, and that money kept at interest for the daughters of John Smith, &c. my grand daughters (viz) Nancy Collin, Esey Smith, Eliza Smith, Emily Smith and Martha Jane Smith and as they arrive to lawful age each to receive an equal portion of said money.

8th. After the death of my wife wife Christian Smith the negro barrel I will

 and Jacob Fair, which said negro I will my daughter to have the benefit of
 during her life in such way as my executors may think best.

9th. After the death of my wife Christian Smith I will the plantation whereon
 I now live with the woodland land thereunto belonging to my grandson
 John R. Smith.

10th. I will that after the death of wife, the estate then left of all and every kind
 and description, except beding (viz) beds, bed clothing, and all other kind of
 clothing which is to be at my wifes disposal, to be sold and the proceeds
 equally divided between all my granddaughters herein named share and share
 alike. (A.B. Note a part of this item is omitted because it is thought to be illegal for
 the clerk to record it as it stands in the original)

11. I will to Moses Johnson a relation that I raised one negro Rebecca
 to be given up to him after the death of my wife Christian Smith

12. And lastly I do hereby appoint William Castleberry and Elias Wilson
 Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof
 I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this nineteenth day of May,
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six (1836)
 signed, sealed and acknowledged.
