all my lands, negroes, stock of all kinds, household and
Kitchen furniture, money, debts due and every other article, thing, or
things which I may be possessed of, during her natural life, and
after her death, I will that my daughter Haney H. Tarver shall have
the use of all the above mentioned property during her natural life,
and after her death, to be equally divided amongst all my grand
children (children of my said daughter Haney H. Tarver) & have each
share alike.

Item 3rd I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my
wife Obedience Draper sole Executrix of this my last
last Will and Testament.

 8th I give to Abner Wymme, Son of James Wymme, one negro
 girl named Caroline —
 9th I give to Loker Ann Wymme, daughter of James Wymme, one
 negro girl, named Martha —
