Farver shall have the use of all the above mentioned property during her natural life, and after her death, to be equally divided amongst all my grandchildren (children of my said daughter Nancy H. Farver) share alike.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Obedience Draper sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament.

8<sup>th</sup> I give to Abner Wynne, son of James Wynne, one negro girl named Caroline —

9<sup>th</sup> I give to Lolley Ann Wynne, daughter of James Wynne, one negro girl named Martha —
