State of Georgia Warren County.

I James Morris of the County and State aforesaid Being sick in Body but of sound Mind and perfect Memory do hereby certify to His Honor the Judge of the Peace and to all who may last with an Assistant Juror that all my just debts be paid and that my Will shall be deced without pomp & vanity at the direction of my Executors.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved son William Morris Five Dollars in good and lawful money to be paid him by my Executors and no more.

Thirdly I give also bequeath to my grand son Thomas Morris son of William Morris a Black Mare.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son in Law George Henry one Colley and no more to be paid him by my executors.

Fifthly I request that all my lands Negroes horses cattle eddys and all my estate both real and personal with the exception of the said Black Mare shall be sold by my Executors and the proceeds of the same be equally divided between my beloved children as follows That is to say to my son

Abner Morris one share to my daughter Elizabeth Mathews one share to my son James Morris one share to my son and daughter Henry Mathews and to his wife Margaret Mathews one share to my son Thomas Morris one share

to the children of my son William Morris one share and to the children of my daughter Margaret Morris one share Making in all seven shares.

Sixthly I do make and ordain constitute and appoint my son Abner Morris my son James Morris and my son Thomas Morris my lawful executors to this my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of August 1832 in presence of
