 Warren Co., Georgia being of advanced age and knowing that I must  
 shortly depart this life, do in it right and proper both as respects my family  
 and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind  
 Providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my last will and testament,  
 hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

1 Item. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian  
 like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul,  
 I trust, shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal  
 salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Sord and  
 Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and as I humbly  
 trust enjoyed for twenty years.

2 Item. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay  
 by my Executor herein after appointed as I am unwilling my creditors  
 should be delayed in their rights especially as there is no necessity  
 for delay.

3 Item. I give bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Mary with  
 whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for thirty five years all my estate  
 both real & personal consisting in part of three negroes to wit Phibe  
 a woman and her two children George about thirty seven years of age  
 and Charles about thirty one years of age, also one tract of land where on  
 I now live containing about one hundred & fifty acres a part of which is  
 cleared and in cultivation with all the rights members and appurtenances  
 to said tract of land, in any wise belonging, free from all charges or  
 limitation whatsoever to her own proper use benefit and behoof forever;  
 and all my stock of every kind and description whatsoever consisting  
 of Horses, hogs, cattle &c &c and all my plantation and farming tools &  
 utensils & Household & Kitchen furniture of all kind whatsoever and  
 all the ready cash & notes which may be on hand at my death or in  
 other words all the property which I may die desirous & possessed of of  
 every kind quality & description whatsoever to go to & become the property  
 of my said wife Mary forever with full power to dispose of the same  
 at any time previous or by will or deed at her death as she may think  
 proper.

4 Item. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Executor  
 of this my last will & testament this 16<sup>th</sup> day of July 1847.

Johnson during her natural life if she remain a widow otherwise until the time of her marriage to be used for her support and for the support, rearing and education of my children and at her death or in case of her marriage it is my will that said estate be then divided between my said wife and children and equal share to each.

It is my will and desire that my executor herein after named have power to sell at any time any portion of the personal property of my estate and also a lot of land belonging to me in Lumpkin
