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Before me, John W. Jackson, of the State of Georgia, you, Jelle M. Elliott, do swear that you saw the said Jelle M. Elliott sign seal publish and declare this instrument of writing to be and contain his last will and testament and at the time thereof he was in your opinion & belief of sound and disposing mind & memory & that did it freely and without compulsion & that Richard O. Albany and Eliza P. Smallwood was subscribing witnesses to the same with deponent & that all subscribed the same at the request of testator & in his presence and in the presence of each other to the best of deponents belief

Georgia { In the name of God Amen.
Warren County } I John W. Jackson of the State & County aforesaid being weak & feeble in body but of sound mind & memory calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being unwilling that no understanding should exist at & after my death with regard to my intentions or will think proper to and do make & ordain this to be my last will & testament hereby revoking & making void any other will or wills by me at any time heretofore made in manner and form following.

First I commend my soul to Almighty God who gave it & my body to the earth in decent Christian burial.

Secondly As to such debts as I may be owing at my death I bequeath the payment of the same to my sons Aaron Nathan & Thomas requesting that they will apportion & pay each their proportionate share of the same

Thirdly As to such property as may now appertain to my Estate or may appertain thereto at my death I give & bequeath the same of whatsoever kind it may be to my son Aaron Jackson excepting such as may be otherwise disposed of by this will.

Fourthly I do hereby confirm to my sons Aaron Nathan & Thomas Jackson certain property settled in them by deed executed before the making of this will and bearing date the Twentieth day of February 1846 said property consisting of four negroes to wit Albert Edy Belmont & Mary and their increase

Fifthly I give to my son Lewis Jackson the sum of one dollar

Sixthly I nominate & appoint my son Aaron Jackson the Executor of this my last will & testament.

In the name of God Amen.

I Sarah Banfield alias Sarah Wilder of the State and county aforesaid
 being in the perfect exercise of mind do therefore make constitute and ordain
 this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following

(To wit)

1st I give and bequeath to my sister Mary Wynne five dollars to her
 her heirs and assigns forever.

2nd I give and bequeath to my Brother William Wilder twenty five dollars
 to him his heirs and assigns forever

3rd I give and bequeath to my Brother Solomon Wilder twenty five
 dollars to him his heirs and assigns forever

4th I give and bequeath to my Brother Charles Wilder one negro boy named
 Amos to him his heirs and assigns forever

5th I give and bequeath to my sister Nancy Cloud two negroes a man
 named Bob & a girl named Amanda to her her heirs and assigns forever.

6th I give and bequeath to my niece Mary Hall two negroes girls Eliza
 and Patience to her her heirs and assigns forever

It is nevertheless to be understood that the foregoing bequest to the said
 Mary Hall be subject to the following restrictions (to wit) that should the
 said Mary decede before marriage or without lawful heirs of her body then
 the said negroes to be equally divided between Elizabeth Hall Charles Wilder
 Nancy Cloud and the heirs of Solomon Wilder.

7th It is my will and desire that my tract of Land on the waters of Warts
 Creek adjoining lands of Jerry Perry Charles Wilder and others containing
 to hundred and forty nine Acs more or less also the one half of the Mill
 and Mill Lot containing eight acres more or less on said Warts creek
 also one negro girl named Nancy to have the Privilege of choosing her
