I John McLaughlin of the state of Georgia and county of Warren, being of sound mind and memory do make, ordain and declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament, revoking all others.

First . . . To my beloved wife Eleanore McLaughlin I give and bequeath the whole of my Estate both real and personal, which may be on hand at the time of my Decease, to be used and disposed of at her death or marriage as she may think proper, as I also do my pension that I receive of the United States for my revolutionary services.

Second and lastly. I constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife Eleanore McLaughlin and Atron W. Grier Executrix and Executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 18th December 1855.
