Household & Kitchen furniture with all their inclosure
with two horses, strength and one horse, strong
enough to pull them in good order is my said
wife her life time shall be supported back to
the said State of my debts.

3^d. I give & devise to my Grand Daughter Sally
Scarborough one hundred Dollars
with more the balance of my property & effects
to be equally divided amongst my debts
I do now & do hereby appoint my wife
Elizabeth McMath and William McMath my
son to be my Executors to this my last

Will & Testament to take effect when I have buried
in my hand & seal this twenty fourth day of August
one thousand eight hundred & forty four
