In Superior Court sitting for ordinary purposes Monday 7th November 1836. Present their Honors. J. C. Crawford, Wilson Bird, John W. Rabun, Justices.

The last Will and Testament of Joseph Roberts late of this County deceased being produced in Court by Burch M. Roberts one of the nominated Executors thereof, and the due and legal execution thereof, and that said Testator was of sound and disposing mind at the time of executing said Will by the evidence of Littlebury Tucker, George W. Chinnas and Solomon Rainwater attesting Witnesses to said Will. It is considered that said will is fully proved and that it be recorded.

State of Georgia, Hancock County.

I Joseph Roberts of the County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory at this time (yet of fable body) have thought and do think proper to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament which is as follows.

Item 1st I have given and confirmed unto my son Coleman Roberts five negroes, to wit, Amelia, Albert, Gilbert, Anderson, and Lafayette and their increase as his legacy forever of my estate.

Item 2^d I have given and confirmed unto my son Daniel "W. Roberts the following named negroes, to wit, Bob, Bill, and Maria and their increase as his legacy of my estate, forever.

Item 3rd I have given and confirmed unto my daughter Betsy Ransom, the following named negroes, to wit, Ned, Belia, and her children and their increase, I do likewise leave in the hands of my Executors Four hundred dollars to be applied to the purchase of a negro girl for the benefit of the heirs of my daughter Betsy Ransom.

Item 4th I give and confirm unto the children of my wife's daughter, Fanny Wright the five following named negroes, to wit, Simy, Sally, Richmond, Augustus, and, Aligail and their increase, now in possession of my step daughter; the right and title of, in, and to said negroes, I do fully vest in the children of my step daughter, to be equally divided among them, it is however my wish and desire, that so long as my step daughter does live that said negroes shall remain with her and work for her support, but in no wise subject to her control or that of her husband.

Item 5th I give and confirm unto Burch M. Roberts my son, four negroes named Sam, Lucy, Hetty and Martha and their

increase (which negroes are now in his possession) forever.
 Attest & witness and confirm unto my Son Jesse M. Roberts
 my dear, your negroes named, Jack, Esther, Glasgow and John
 and their increase, (which negroes are now in his possession forever.

Item 7th. I give and confirm unto Rebecca A. Coffries five
 negroes named, Wesley, Hagar, Anthony, Matilda, and
 Calvin, and their increase (which negroes are now in her
 possession) forever.

Item 8th. I give and bequeath unto my wife Clarissa Roberts
 the whole of my negro property not disposed of in the fore-
 going part of this Will, now in my possession and their increase,
 also all my lands, stock of Horses, Mules, Cows, Sheep, household
 and Kitchen Furniture, plantation tools of all kinds, accounts,
 notes, money, and all other species of property of which I am
 possessed of, not disposed of in any preceding items,
 and it is my wish that my wife Clarissa Roberts
 should give unto any younger children as they become of age
 or get married a portion of the above property equal in
 value to that I have herein given to Birchill M. Roberts,
 Jesse M. Roberts and Rebecca A. Coffries and no more,
 the rest of said property to be applied to her own proper
 benefit and use during her natural life, and at her death,
 the balance that may be in her possession at that time to
 be equally divided between the children which I ^{have} begotten
 by her alone, and further that Birchill M. Roberts, Jesse
 M. Roberts and Clarissa Roberts do act as my executors
 to execute this my last Will and Testament.
