I Marcus Posy of the County of Warren and State aforesaid  
Considering that life is uncertain and being weak in body but  
of sound mind & memory do on this twentieth day of March in  
the Year of our Lord eighteen hundred & thirty one make  
and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form  
following

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I commit my soul to Almighty God who gave it  
Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I request that all my just debts should be paid  
after which (Item) I give & bequeath to my beloved Brother  
Samuel Posay fifty dollars provided he claims the same with  
in twelve months after my decease if not it will be divided  
between my four half brothers and Sisters which will be  
hereafter named

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my beloved mother, Rebecca Lewis  
all the residue of my estate both real & personal of  
every description that may remain after my just debts is paid  
also the legacies above mentioned are paid off and discharged where  
ever it consists of Money Notes Book accounts Stock in trade  
and every other Item or part of my property both real & personal  
of which I may die possessed and not heretofore mentioned  
in this Instrument during her Natural life

Item 4 After the decease of my beloved Mother it is my wish  
that the whole be divided equally between William M. Lewis  
Walter F. Lewis, Alfred A. Lewis, and Mary M. Lewis or so  
many of them as may at that time be in existence

Lastly I nominate & constitute & appoint My Mother Rebecca Lewis  
Executive and Sean Hill my Executor of this my last  
will & testament hereby investing them with full power to  
carry the same into effect
