

35 State of Georgia Noncompetitive Will of Martha Miller

Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852
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Martha Miller her will by word of mouth make and declare by her in the latter part of the year 1832 and the early part of 1833 and at different times since that time in presence of us who hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses hereto.

My Will is that all my just debts be paid (if there is any) and that all my Estate belong to my grand niece Mary Ann Davis. My bed, bedstead and furniture to be given her by my Executor, and all the balance of my household or other property to be sold and the money arising therefrom together with all my notes or money to belong to the said Mary Ann Davis to be paid her by my Executor at the time she arrives at legal age, or marries and her desired further that Daniel Dennis should act as her executor or procure some person to act for her.

Daniel Dennis at his oath swears that the facts set forth in the above Will are just and true and that the Dictator called on this deponent to have it copied into effect. This he swears to the best of his knowledge and understanding.
