

Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852
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In the name of God amen.

I Mary Andrews of the county aforesaid do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit, To God I bet in my soul, and my body to the earth in christian burial, - and of my temporal goods, I give first

To my Executor herein after named, to be sold at such time, place, and on such terms as he may think best, the following ten negroes, namely, Cady, Aggy, (the infant of Cady,) Jeff, Deal, Sarah, Judy, Jesh, Liberty, Hebold and Ben and the proceeds, or so much thereof as is necessary, paid to my son Moncaliborn Andrews, in discharge of an award lately found in his favor against me.

Second. I give to my son Moncaliborn Andrews one dollar.

Third. I give to my Executor the nine following negroes, to wit, Charles Aggy, Rabun, Joseph, Henry, Newton, William, Moss, and Sheba, together with one half of all the balance of my estate, of whatever name or nature, real or personal, to be sold at such time, place, and on such terms as he may think best, and the annual interest for so much thereof as is necessary, appropriated as my said Executor may think best for the support of my son Edwin R. Andrews and family during his life; and at his death till the children die, many or some of age - after which, if they have children, the principal is to be equally divided among them and their representatives share and share alike by families - but if no child or children of Edwin R. Andrews is living, but grand children of his, then to be divided by the family. And if neither child, children, grandchild or grandchild, then the whole is to go to my daughter Sarah S. Baker and her heirs forever. Provided that two hundred dollars a year, shall be paid to the widow of my said son Edwin R. Andrews (after all other of the foregoing expenses are withdrawn from her) during her widowhood. And provided my said Executor shall not be held responsible to any person for any loss that may result from placing my said son Edwin R. on a farm, with hands, &c. if my said Executor should think proper at any time to do so.

Fourth. I give in the balance of my estate, whether real or personal, to my daughter Sarah S. Baker, to have and to hold forever.

Fifth. The debts are to be paid out of all my estate, except the negroes.

Sixth. I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Thomas Gibson & Nathan C. Layre executors of this my last will and testament.

Be it known that at the within named Mary Andrews being still of sound and disposing mind and memory, in consequence of a sale made by me since the date of the foregoing will, of the negroes named in the foregoing first item and as the money received on said sale has been applied to the partial payment of the debt due to my son Monahan and in consequence of the recollection of my son Edwin R. I do make and declare the foregoing to be my said will.

First I hereby revoke and annul the said first, third, and fourth items of said will and the bequests therein contained and instead of the first item I confirm to my daughter Sarah S. Baker the debt of conscience heretofore incurred by me to her for the negroes named in said item and thus meet as I have said to my said daughter the negroes named in said third item of my will except Charles I hereby confirm to be the said negroes, she complying with her contract to pay to the children of my son Edwin R. the sum of four thousand dollars in said bond note expressed at this time and in the manner therein specified.

Secondly, I authorize and direct the aforesaid executors, and either of them, or the person who shall qualify to this will to sell all the land of which I am seized, or to which I may be entitled in such manner, and on such terms as they may deem expedient, and the perishable and other personal estate of which I may be possessed - and after the payment of all just debts and necessary expenses of the settlement and administration of my estate, I direct that the one half of what may remain be vested in Bank stock in the name of the executor or of some competent person as trustee, or in undoubted notes - and I direct that the interest thereon annually be paid to the guardian of my two grand children, Charles and Albert, sons of Edwin R. one of the survivors of them until the younger one attains the age of twenty one year - and then the capital be equally divided between them if in life - and if either be dead the entire amount, to the survivor, and if both shall die before the age of twenty one, then I give said sum to my daughter Sarah A. and in the event of her decease before said grand children, or the survivor shall be entitled to receive under this bequest, (and both of them being dead) I give said sum to my grand daughter Josephine Johnson. The other half of said residue I give to my said daughter Sarah S. Baker, and I confirm to her the gift made of two feather beds, two spreads or counterpanes, with the usual furniture thereof to be selected
