Will of Micajah Rogers, dec'd

State of Georgia, Warren County.

In the name of God Amen. I Micajah Rogers, of the County aforesaid, do make
this my last will & Testament in manner and form following, to wit, To God I
return you soul who gave it, and my body to The Earth in decent burial
And for my temporal goods I Give, I give my beloved wife Martha the three
tracts of land whereon I now live granted to Gible, Howard and Plauden Negroes
Pety, Samons, Aba, Maria, and her four children, Randolph, child of Pety, one
year provisions for herself, family and stock - Mules Pety, Rock, mare Samy
Cary & her young at foot and the Samter mare. Five first choice hogs, calves, five
best cows & pigs, five good does, and a due proportion of any other live stock. The pians
to remain in her possession for the three youngest children when they come of age.
That she is to have during her life or widowhood and therewith to raise and
educate my three youngest children. And at her death to be equally divided
between all my children - My grandson Micajah Wilson to receive no part of it.
I wish all the balance of my estate, whether consisting of land, negroes, stock
debts due to - all turned into money and equally divided between my wife and all
my children, share and share alike My wife to have the use of that part that falls
to her during her life. My grandson Micajah Wilson to receive no part.
The Executor to sell at such times, places and under such circumstances as his
prudence and economy may dictate. My will is to receive all that may be come

to the three youngest children at any time and on any account, and to have also the said property for their benefit till they come of age, and if there is more than is necessary to maintain herself and three youngest children, she may lend it out for the benefit of the children.

If my wife should marry, then let my minor children have guardians to manage their property or estate, which she must pay out.

I give my grandson Micajah Wilson five hundred dollars, one horse, saddle & bridle; and if he should die before he is twentyone years of age, it is to be then equally divided among all my children.

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my wife executrix and my son John Rogers Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
