 Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852
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In the name of God Amen.

I Moses McKinney of the county aforesaid do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following to wit—
 First I give my daughter Elvira Hall during her life and then to her children forever Eight negroes to wit Litty, Hilliard, Minna, Catharine, Kelly, Shadrick, Hannah, and Step, together with their increase or issue, except Julia and one thousand dollars, with receipts I hold on her husband Joel Hall for nine hundred dollars.

Second, I give my son Kinchen, the tract of land whereon he now lives in Warren county on the waters of Rocky Comfort, adjoining lands of Thomas Lockett, John W. Kinsy and others containing six hundred acres, more or less, a negro man Henry or Harry a woman Rhoda and her increase, an man Dick, a boy Alfred & boy George, should he die without legal child or children then living, to be equally divided between my other children & their representatives.

Third, I give Son Henry McKinney, the tract of land whereon I now live on the waters of Birch-Creek, adjoining lands of David E. Hodo, Benjamin Adams, Prudence Persons and others, containing seven hundred & fifty acres, more or less, a negro man Isaac, a man Jack, a woman Lucy & her increase, a Boy Bob, a girl Tresey, & her increase, Milla, & her increase, a boy Sy, Will & Daniel, one sett Blacksmith Tools &c. Road Waggon and Harness, one Gun & running-Gear, one cart & steers, a Bay mare called Charlotte a Bay horse called Kentucky, a bay Horse called Adonis.

Two Feather Beds. Stairs & furniture, one Clock, one side board, one folding Table, one common Table, twelve Chairs, all my Glass and Earthen ware, all my Kitchen utensils & furniture & a sufficient quantity of corn fodder, meat &c. for the sustenance of himself and family for one year, my stock of Hogs, known by the creek hogs Two cows and calves & Stock of Cows.

Fourth, I give to my Grand daughter Harriet Martha Hall a girl Julian,

Fifth, I give to my Grand son Samuel Moses Hall a Sord horse with a Striak in his forehead known ^{called} by the name of Shakespear also three hundred dollars when he attains to the age of Twenty one years, with interest after my death to be paid to him by my Executors.

Sixth, My request is that Nancy, & her increase Ben, for Annalliga not to be separated, but be valued and drawn for the whole family together by my legal heirs, and the one

drawing pay to the others an equal proportion of their valuation.

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my Son Kinchen McKinney, Joel Hall & William Harris, Executors of this my last will & Testament, in case of failure of either then my Son Henry to constitute one of my executors
