I Nancy Adkins knowing that it is appointed for all people to
 die being low in body, but in sound mind & memory do before
 Almighty God, & these witness, make & ordain, this my last
 will & Testament, viz: First I bequeath to the grave in
 decent burial, & my soul to God who gave it, as touching earthly
 affairs, I will & bequeath as follows: after my debts are all paid
 First, I give to my son Absalom, the oldest Sorrel mare &
 all my hogs, all the cattle, with the exception of five head,
 also one bed & furniture & half of the Kitchen furniture, also
 half the household furniture, with the exception of beds &
 furniture & twenty dollars in ready money & this present trap.
 2ndly, I give & bequeath to my daughter Martha (the Spotted mare
 & one cow & calf, also the ready money, with the exception of
 twenty dollars that is what money is in hand, one bed & furniture
 & one half of the other household & kitchen furniture, except the
 beds & furniture, also one hundred dollars & the Geese twenty
 head.
 3d, I give & bequeath to my Son Lazarus, the colt & one black
 heifer, also one bed & furniture.

4th I give & bequeath to my son Daniel fifty dollars, also one bed

www.georgiapioneers.com white horse, also the Sheep, two head & my chest.
 5th, I give to my son Andrew, one bed & furniture, one bed horse,
 one box & one hundred dollars & all the estate that may then be
 left. I bequeath to them to be equally divided among all my
 children. To Martha interlayment of the wood furniture. To Daniel
 interlayment of the wood white, before assigned.

^{increasement of} their Stock until they are of age, or marry & then to pay each one his portion. Also that my son Absalom Jackson keep the children together & give the boys each, one years Schooling free of charge.
