Georgia Warren County, I, the name of the aforesaid God
 Nancy Thompson of said County widow of Nathaniel
 Thompson being now of sound and disposing mind and
 memory but feeble in health and living desirous to
 dispose of my estate do make and declare the following
 as my last will and Testament,

I desire that my remains be interred in a decent and
 Christian like manner - and that all of my just debts
 be paid, I wish my executors to sell all my estate
 both real and personal after the payment of my
 just debt the proceeds thereof to be divided into seven
 equal ~~shares~~ shares and to be distributed as follows
 to wit, I will and bequeath to my sons Benjamin
 Thompson Stephen Thompson Nathaniel Thompson
 Bell Thompson and Polkly Thompson each and
 share and their wife and to James S. Thompson
 and John B. Thompson children of my son John
 Thompson and their and I further give and bequeath
 to my son Bell Thompson as further the remaining
 share of my estate to wit one seventh part thereof
 in trust to and for the support and benefit of my
 daughter Mary Gibbons during her life free and
 exempt from the claims and rights of her
 husband and on her decease to be equally divided

William B. Gibson, Thomas C. Gibson, Henry T. Gibson,
and William B. Gibson - and I wish said Trustee to
invest said share in such manner as he may deem
most conducive to the interests of my daughter Mary
Gibson and her said children.

I nominate and appoint my son Bill Thompson
executor of this my last will and testament hereby
revoking all and every former will by me made,
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this the twenty sixth day of September in the year of our
Lord eighteen hundred and forty five in
