Georgia Warren County, In the name of the everliving God
I Nancy Thompson of said County widow of Nathaniel
Thompson being now of sound and disposing mind and
memory but feeble in health and being desirous to
dispose of my estate do make and declare the following
as my last will and testament,
I desire that my remains be interred in a decent and
Christian like manner - and that all of my just debts
be paid, I wish my executors to sell all my estate
both real and personal and after the payment of my
just debts the proceeds thereof to be divided into seven
equal ~~parts~~ shares and to be distributed as follows
To wit, I will and bequeath to my sons Benjamin
Thompson Stephen Thompson Nathaniel Thompson
Belle Thompson and Polkville Thompson each and
share and share alike and to James S. Thompson
and John B. Thompson children of my son John
Thompson and share and I further give and bequeath
to my son Belle Thompson, as trustee the remaining
share of my estate to wit one seventh part thereof
in trust to and for the support and benefit of my
daughter Mary Gibson during her life free and
exempt from the claims and rights of her
husband and on her decease to be equally divided

William Gibson Thomas C. Gibson Henry J. Gibson
and William B. Gibson. and I wish said Justice to
invest said share in such manner as he may deem
most conducive to the interest of my daughter Mary
Gibson and her said children.

I nominate and appoint my son Bill Thompson
executor of this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all and every former will by me made,
In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal
this the twenty sixth day of September in the year of our
Lord eighteen hundred and forty five

Signed sealed and declared Nancy Thompson
by the Justices to be her last will and Testament in our presence
who in her presence and in the
presence of each other have hereto
subscribed our names
