

The Last Will & Testament of Nicholas Harbuck

I, Nicholas Harbuck of the County
of State aforesaid being weak in body of sound
mind & disposing mind and memory do make certain
and constitute this my last Will & Testament
Commencing my debt to God and My body to the
Earth in decent burial (my body to be buried in the
Cemetary first) I my above wife Barbara Harbuck
the land whereon I now live containing one hundred
acres more or less the Negro boy named David
about sixteen years of age one Horse one Mule
and Cattle all my lot of land crops stock and
household furniture plantations tools and any
other Goods chattels rights or credits of whatever
Name or Nature I may be possessed of

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all to be and remain in her possession and service during her life (except as is herein after excepted)
 2^d I desire the sum of fifty dollars to my Daughter C. B. Gilling worth when I die fifty Dollars and to share at the Death of my Wife the sum of money as much money as was made by her stock equal to the rest of my Daughters except Annina & Anna

3^d I consider the property already devised to my Daughter Rebecca worth when I die fifty dollars and share at the Death of my Wife her part or portion may be made equal to the rest of my Daughters except Annina & Anna

4th I consider the property already devised to my son William Backus to be worth more than one hundred dollars when I die, & therefore I can give him nothing more because I have more than share give the rest of my children

5th I consider the property already devised to my Daughter Maria that she have been worth one hundred dollars and share at the Death of my Wife that so much money may be equally divided between my two Sons William Backus & John Backus as well make up one share equal to the rest of my Daughters except Annina & Anna

6th I consider the property already devised to my Daughter Maria that she have been worth fifty two dollars and share that she may

have one hundred dollars at the Death of my Wife more than any of my other Daughters except Anna because she is inferior

7th I consider the property already devised to my Daughter Susan Backus to have been worth fifty two dollars and share that it may be and remain in her possession and service during her life with as much money as will make one share equal to each of my other Daughters except Annina & Anna and at her death to be given to my two Grandchildren William Green & Anna Barbara Backus to be equally divided they will equally divide it with their Brothers and sisters should they

8th I give to my Daughter Anna Backus at my death her share of my property one hundred dollars and the same should be equal to any of my children except Annina and Anna and be equally divided to them

9th I give my Grandson William Backus the share of Anna and should be equal to any of my other children

10th I desire at the Death of my Wife that each and every part of my

children and the Legacies herein mentioned
have out of the proceeds
