State of Georgia Being in perfect mind and memory thank
^{you} God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body
and knowing that is now appointed for all men to die
I do make and ordain this my last will and testa-
ment as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has
been pleased unto God to bless me with in this life. I give
and demise and dispose of the same in the following
form and manner.

- 1st I give to my beloved son William Wiggins one dollar
- 2nd I give to my beloved son Amos Wiggins one dollar
- 3rd I give to my beloved son in law Reuben May one dollar
- 4th I give to Rebecca Halloway formerly Rebecca Wiggins
and to the heirs of my beloved son Peter Wiggins one dollar
- 5th I give to Sally Wiggins strictly five dollars to be paid
to her when she arrived at the age of twenty one
- 6th My will and desire is that my beloved wife Sarah
Wiggins have all my estate both real and personal
until my son Richard Nor Franklin Wiggins
arrives at the age of twenty one years and then for
him to have one third of my estate both real and personal
- 7th And for my wife to have the remaining two thirds
until my daughter Martha Mary Sarah and Mahala
Wiggins arrives at the age of twenty one years and
then for her to have one third of all my personal
estate and then for my wife to have the remaining
third of my estate both real and personal

33 during her life widowhood and after her death for
all my lands and the third of my personal estate that
is left to my wife.

8th My will and desire is that if either of the two last
named children that is Richard or Franklin Miggins
Orang and Martha Mary Sarah Ann Mahalia Miggins
should die for the surviving child to have the property
that is left to the one that shall die I do hereby dis-
allow Revokes and Rescinds all and every other will
or Legacies bequests and Executors in any before named
will or bequest. Testifying and Confirming this to be my
Last Will & Testament.

I do hereby appoint Jeremiah Melchay Amos Miggins
& Reuben May my Executors to carry my last Will
and Testament. Signed sealed and published 6th September
