

The Last Will & Testament of Sally Baker and

Georgia. In the Name of God. Amen.
Marion County. I Sally Baker, of the State & County aforesaid (Widow) being weak & indisposed in body & health, but thro' Divine goodness, of sound and disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal life, and the certainty of death, knowing that it is appointed for all Men kind once to die, have thought proper to make and contain this my Last Will and Testament, in the following manner & form: Viz. My last Will and Testament, I hereby as it has pleased the merciful God to appoint, it bless me in this, I dispose of as follows: Viz. It is my Will and desire that my son Henry Baker do have the use and possession of the land and Plantation whereon I now dwell, with evere buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging, for & during the term of two years, or two Crop seasons, next after the time of my decease; for which purpose, I lend the same to him, during that space of Time & Subject nevertheless to the following Proviso: Viz. Should my decease happen at a Season of the year when a Crop is Retailed, or standing in the field, in that case, I give & Bequeath to my said son Henry Baker,

he to hold the land and premises, by virtue of the con-
veyance, only for one other cropping season, then next succeeding
and after the expiration of the said term, it is my wish
and desire that the said land and premises be sold, and
the proceeds thence arising, disposed of as herein after
expressed and directed.

late and before, and since granted to me, in the above
District of (then) Monroe County, November 14th, it is my
Will and I be sold, in such manner as my Executor shall
conceive to be the way, advantage to the Discharge of

of this my last Will and Testament, Renouncing, Disavow-
ing and renouncing every other will or Testament
by me made, signing following and confirming the
