

The last Will & Testament of Samuel T. Hillman

Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852

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Georgia Warren County I Samuel Hillman being weak in body but sound in mind & memory do make this my last Will & Testament first & I will that all my just debts be paid out of any money that my Executors may think best.

Second I Will & bequeath unto my beloved wife Grace Hillman all my Estate both real & personal that is not otherwise disposed by this my last Will.

Third I Will, to Frances Hillman my Mother, part of a tract of land bought of Clayton Buff and part of one other tract bought of Robert Warren to begin on a pine corner near the mouth of the line between myself & William Sell, and run a straight line to a stump near an old Barn near Caleb Hillmans House on my back line and to include all that part of said S. Surveys that lays Eastwardly of the above named line on both sides of Childers Creek during her natural life and after her Death to be equally divided between Samuel Hillman son of Caleb & Winder Hillman son of Joshua Hillman also I leave my Negro man Chester to my Mother together with my brown Mares Colt.

(a horse Colt) also my Gray Horse, also that she have a reasonable portion of Corn wheat and meat to serve her One year and after her Death to be equally divided between my Brothers Daughters (Viz) Frances Grace Martha Mary Ann & Ellen Hillman Daughters of Joshua Hillman and Susan Eliza Lucy daughters of Caleb Hillman

Fourth I Give & bequeath to my Brother, Ephraim Hillman, one tract of land drawn in the fourth District of Early County by Winder Hillman also my watch.

Fifth I Give & bequeath one half of my Books to my nephew John Hillman the books to us equally as may be divided and my beloved wife Grace Hillman to take her choice when so divided.

Lastly I appoint my friends (Bilington Sanders and Robert Sargent) my Executors to carry this my last Will into effect.
