Wagon County, Georgia, this 1820, 1852, God Amen.

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Warren County, I Sarah Heath being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following to wit, My soul I give to God, who gave it me and my body to the earth in decent burial, for my worldly goods I give and bequeath in the following manner to wit-

- 1st Item - I will my just debts to be paid, out of the effects of my Estate first
- 2nd This item omitted because it is illegal
- 3rd This item omitted by order of court.

4th I will and bequeath the balance of my Estate both real and personal to be sold and divided equal except one bed & furniture among the 4 named children, Henry, John, Matha H. children & William children.

5th I will and bequeath unto my beloved son Henry Heath the fourth part of my remains.

6th I will and bequeath unto my son John Heath the one fourth part of my remains.

7th I will and bequeath unto my beloved son William Heath's 3 children Sarah Jane & Susan Ann the fourth part of my remains.

8th I will and bequeath to my son Matha H. Heath & children to wit, William, Henry,

Caroline, Alice, John Thomas, Harriett Elvira, Sarah Ann &c. one fourth part of my remains, and my son Matha H. to have and control his natural life.

9th I will and bequeath unto my beloved grand daughter Sarah Jane Heath, one bed & furniture the above excepted.

10th I will and bequeath my son Henry Heath, Executor to my last will & Testament.
