 to my said deceased husbands estate and I have or may have in or to
 according to Law and Equity for them my Trustees to use and occupy
 for the use and benefit of my said Daughter and her said Infant Child
 for and during the life of my said daughter I Give and bequeath the
 remainder of the said Estate to my said Grand daughter and to her
 and to her heirs forever
