 J. Leabon Johnson of said State and County being of middle age
 and knowing that I must shortly depart this life; desiring to
 right and proper both as respects my family and myself, that I
 shall make a disposition of the property which a wise provision
 has blessed me; do therefore make this my last will and testament
 hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.
 Item 1st

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
 and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances
 and conditions in life. My soul I trust shall return
 to rest with God who gave it - as I hope you eternal
 salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed
 Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ - whose religion I have
 professed and as I humbly trust enjoyed for ten years.
 Item 2nd

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 without delay by my executors hereafter appointed as
 I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their
 rights especially as there is no necessity for delay.
 Item 3rd

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
 Nancy with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet -
 for two years my lot of land in Warren County where
 I now live two hundred and seventy acres of land part
 cleared and in cultivation with all the rights, members
 and appurtenances to said lot of land in anywise
 belonging free from all charges or limitations whatever,
 to her own proper use benefit and behoof forever, with
 full power to dispose of the same at any time previous
 or by will or deed at her death as she may think proper
 I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife one half
 of all the rest of my property consisting of horses hogs
 cattle and sheep farmery utensils house hold and kitchen
 furniture also the half of my negroes, Iz. a man called
 for about 45 years of age a woman Phally about 40
 years of age Anthony a boy about 4 years old -
 Washington about 6 years old Caroline a girl about
 5 years old Bill a boy 3 years old Mary a girl about
 1 year old Fannie about 31 years old Sarah over 17
 years old. The last two named negroes viz Fannie
 and Sarah are I want my wife to keep for her

own use or disposal of them by hiring them out as
she shall think best the other half of last term of said property
I give to my child which my wife is now pregnant
with, I want my Brother Amos Johnson to take the
balance of the negroes and keep them until a division
is made, which will be when the child comes of
age, and for three disinterested persons to value them
and say what they are worth at year for the hire
of them, for which he is to pay in the Estate every
year, also to pay over to my wife the money to
assist her in living or same part thereof if
she should need it.

Item 4th

I hereby constitute and appoint my dear
Brother Amos Johnson and my worthy friend
William G. Scroggs Executrix of this my last
will & Testament, this May 15th 1851.

I Barnard W. Franklin of the County aforesaid
State aforesaid, being in fable health but of sound mind
disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty
of human life and the certainty of death - and being desirous
of making some disposition of my worldly affairs with
which it has pleased God to bless me, while I have strength
and capacity to do so, Do hereby publish and declare this to be
my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other last
wills and Testaments which I may have made, unto
(first) I command my soul to god who gave it and my body
to the earth in decent burial.

Second, My will is that all my just debts be paid by my
executors herein after appointed as soon after my decease
as ~~by the law of Georgia~~ ^{the law of Georgia} convenient,

Item 1st, I give unto my grand daughter Adeline Gibson
(four hundred dollars in cash,

Item 2nd, I give unto my ^{wife} daughter Ellen Lyrah my
gold watch which I now wear.

Item 3rd, I give unto the children of Thomas J. and
Caroline Wheeler each two hundred dollars.

Item 4th, My will is that the balance of my estate
real and personal and money be divided by my executors
into three equal parts or ~~quarters~~, the one third I give
to my daughter Adeline Lyrah, wife of Dr Edward T.
Lyrah for her sole and separate use free from the
Contracts, debts, or liabilities of her friends or ~~husbands~~
