 All men by these presents that I Solomon Lockett  
 being of sound mind & of good disposing memory, have thought  
 proper to make this my Last Will and Testament. It is my wish  
 that my burial and funeral expenses and all my just  
 debts be paid before any division shall take place.  
 Item 1. give to my beloved wife Patty Lockett during her  
 natural life or widowhood Fourteen Negroes namely  
 Jack, Patsy, George, John, Miller, Randal, Alfred, William  
 Hampton, Ben, Julia, Jerry, Anderson and Charles also the  
 Solomon tract of land on which I live containing four  
 hundred acres more or less and the tract I bought of Mr.  
 Wright & orphans. And all the stock on this place of Horses,  
 Mules, oxen, Cows, & calves Hogs, dogs & pigs, Waggon & carts, Curr  
 & all the plantation tools the carriage Household and  
 kitchen furniture a sufficiency of corn fodder oats &c  
 for one year.

Item 2. I give to my grand daughter Rebecca A. Lockett the  
 following Negroes, viz: Dinah, Moses, Scott & Jeffrey also one  
 hundred and fifty dollars to buy a Horse bridle & saddle one  
 bed & furniture. But if she should die without a lawful issue  
 of her body it shall all return back to my estate.

Item 3. I give to my son Uriah T. Lockett, all the property  
 I have putt in his possession the land, & yet of my daughter  
 Cynthia Chapman & to Thomas Greer also the Mill and Mill  
 tract of land.

Item 4. I give to my son James Lockett, My daughter A Cynthia  
 Chapman, Cullen & Uriah T. Lockett, and my grand  
 daughter Rebecca Lockett all the money, Notes, land  
 goods and chattels that I may die seised and possessed off  
 not already given away to share & share about also any that  
 may revert or come back to my estate. If Rebecca should  
 die without a lawful issue of her body her part shall  
 revert back to my estate.

Item 5. I hereby nominate and appoint my sons  
 James and Uriah T. Lockett to carry into effect  
 this my last Will and Testament, I hereby revoke and  
 disannul all others whatsoever.

Signed, sealed and delivered on the ninth day of July  
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
 and thirty six.
