I Thomas Ausley of the State of Georgia & county
 of Warren, being weak in body, but of sound disposing mind & memory,
 and calling unto mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die - do make & ordain this my last will
 & Testament, & first, and principally of all, I give my soul into the hands
 of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth,
 to be buried in decent christian burial, and as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I
 give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, to wit,
 First, I give and bequeath to my son John Ausley thirty eight acres of
 where he has formerly lived valued at four hundred dollars, not to be
 enthrallled on account of any rent, lying in said county, one bed and
 Furniture already received -

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son Silman Ausley one bay mare
 valued at one hundred & fifty dollars, one bed & furniture, thirty dollars
 paid to Jno. C. Holcombe, and four hundred & fifty dollars paid to
 Thomas J. Hardaway

Item 3^d I give & bequeath to my son Alfred Ausley one Bay
 mare valued at one hundred & fifty dollars, one bed and Furniture.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to son James Ausley one bed & furniture.

Item 5th I give & bequeath to my daughter Malinda, who intermarried
 with James Lavender, one bed & furniture -

Item 6th I give & bequeath to my son William Ausley, one bed &
 Furniture, not yet received, the rest being received -

Item 7th I give & bequeath to my son Richmond A. Ausley
 one Bay horse valued at eighty dollars already received
 and one bed & furniture not received -

Item 8th I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ansley Two beds & furniture.
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Item 9th I give & bequeath to my son Samuel Ansley, one bed & furniture, To have more schooling. -

Item 10th I give & bequeath to my son Josephus R. Ansley, one bed & furniture, And his raising & schooling -

And after my death, my will & desire is that all my Estate both real & personal be sold according to law, and that all my just debts be paid, and then, that all my children afore named be made Equal, so that they share & share alike, some having had, more than others -

And further, that I nominate & appoint my sons James Ansley & William Ansley Executors to this my last will & Testament fully ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my said last will & Testament -

In Testimony whereof the said Thomas Ansley, hath herunto set his hand & affixed his Seal, this thirtyfirst day of July Eighteen hundred & thirtyseven - (1837)
