

The last Will & Testament of Wilson Dawson, dec.

Warren County, Georgia Wills 1829-1852

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God Amen.

I Wilson Dawson, of the State of Georgia in the County of Warren; being sick of body; but in perfect mind and memory; blessed be God for it; but calling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed once for man to die. Do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

First I recommend my Soul into the hands of ^{Almighty} God; that gave it; and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors as to the goods that it has pleased God to bless me with I give in the following manner. Viz.

I will that the two lots of land which I drew in the Lottery one District and Section not recollected (Gold) the other in the 10th Dist. and first Section No. 134. (Land) be sold and the money put on interest for the benefit of my two sons; Isaac Dawson and Harmon Dawson.

I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law William Cunaway one dollar.

I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law John Wood one dollar.

I give and bequeath unto my son-in-law Stephen Rogers one dollar.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Prudence Dawson all the residue of my Estate not otherwise disposed of during her natural life or widowhood, and at her death or marriage to be equally divided between my three ~~children~~ youngest daughters, Rebecca Dawson, Mariam Dawson & Adaline Dawson.

And last of all I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Prudence Dawson, my Executrix to this my last Will and Testament, till that is fulfilled; making void all other wills by me made and declaring this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and affix my Seal; this the 6th of January 1834.

I Thomas Ansley of the State of Georgia & County
 of Warren, being weak in body, but of sound disposing mind & memory,
 and calling unto mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die - do make & ordain this my last will
 & Testament, & first, and principally of all, I give my soul into the hands
 of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth,
 to be buried in decent christian burial, and as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I
 give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, to wit,
 First, I give and bequeath to my son John Ansley thirty eight acres of
 where he has formerly lived valued at four hundred dollars, not to be
 enthrallled on account of any rent, lying in said county, one bed and
 furniture already received -

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Silman Ansley one bay mare
 valued at one hundred & fifty dollars, one bed & furniture, thirty dollars
 paid to Jno. C. Salcombe, and four hundred & fifty dollars paid to
 Thomas J. Hardaway

Item 3rd I give & bequeath to my son Alfred Ansley one Bay
 mare valued at one hundred & fifty dollars, one bed and furniture.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to son James Ansley one bed & furniture.

Item 5th I give & bequeath to my daughter Malinda, who intermarried
 with James Lavender, one bed & furniture -

Item 6th I give & bequeath to my son William Ansley, one bed &
 furniture, not yet received, the rest being received -

Item 7th I give & bequeath to my son Richmond A. Ansley
 one Bay horse valued at eighty dollars already received
 and one bed & furniture not received -
