 Maria Gentry } Personally appeared in Open Court, James Hagan,
 and being duly sworn, he swore and said that he saw the within
 named Eliza Roberts, late of Colletts and Remond's the foregoing
 instrument of writing or her last will and testament, and that at
 the time of seeing her, was in the opinion of the deponent, of sound
 and disposing mind & memory, and that this deponent at the request
 said Eliza Roberts, and in his presence, signed the said last will &
 testament as a witness, and also he saw Sarah Eliza Hagan
 describe the same, as a witness thereto. James Hagan,
 sworn and subscribed as her last will.

The last will and Testament of William Anderson deceased.

In the name of God Amen
 I, William Anderson of the county
 of Chatham, after said being made of, body and of
 sound mind, and memory, do make and
 declare this to be my last will and testament
 Item 1st I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah
 Anderson during her natural life the
 tract of land whereon I am now living
 the several wages and appurtenances whatever
 together with the following negroes (Tom, Phineas,
 Frank, Pomer, Diah, the two) & her increase
 and when she dies the land then to belong to my
 three sons John, William and Isaac and the ne-
 groes left to her to be equally divided among
 my four youngest children John, William, Sel-
 ly, Betty and Isaac to them and their heirs

forever. And it is further my wish that (if it is
 the wish of either of sons) to improve and settle
 upon any part of the land in order for a set-
 tlement for them that they shall be suffered
 to do.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy
 Smith five negroes (Condit, Chaney, mounting
 Nina, Patience & Hopsy) during her natural life and
 then to be equally divided among the three suc-
 ceeding heirs of her body to them and their heirs
 forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty
 Peter the following negroes to wit: Hopsy
 and her 2 children Betty, Isaac and Nancy one lot
 and furniture and cow and cut of dressing her
 natural life and when she dies to the three suc-
 ceeding heirs of her body to them and their heirs
 forever.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son John
 Anderson one negro boy named Har-
 ry to him and his heirs and assigns
 forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son William
 Anderson one negro boy named Brown to
 him and his heirs forever.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty
 Anderson one negro boy named Mary and one boy
 named Hopsy her natural life and then to her lawful
 heirs & assigns to them and their heirs forever.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty
 Anderson one negro boy named Hopsy during her
 natural life and then to her lawful heirs if any
 to them and their heirs forever.

Item 8th I give and bequeath my son Isaac Anderson
