for my executors and administrators, the following property, to wit:
First, I bequeath and direct all my just debts to be paid, and I bequeath
Secondly, I wish for my beloved wife, Lucy Fugate, to have the use of
all the lands where I now live, containing about hundred & seventy acres,
along with the plantation tools, during her life time or widowhood,
and no longer, and then to be equally divided amongst my five boys,
namely, John, William, James, Robertson & Franklin.
Thirdly, I give to my Daughter, Mary Fugate, one Feather Bed and
furniture, and two cows and calves.
Fourthly, I give to my son John Fugate, one Churn, one (Kew) &
Fifthly, I give to my Daughter Susan, William, two cows & two calves &
Sixthly, I give to my Daughter Barbara Fugate, one Feather Bed, when
she comes of age. Seventhly, I give to my Daughter Fanny Fugate,
one Feather Bed, when she comes of age.
Eighthly, It is also my desire that my beloved wife, Lucy Fugate, have
the use of the best of my property, her life time or widowhood, and no
longer, for the use and raising of my six youngest children, (William,
Robertson, Franklin and Susan) and it is also my
desire that my six youngest children should be educated out of my
property.

 a girl a Slave named Vtelle daughter of Censar; and after the
 death of my said daughter Elizabeth, I bequeath the said
 two Slaves with their increase, to the children of the said Elizabeth
 to them, their heirs & assigns: And I do hereby place the
 two Slaves under the management & control of the said Charles
 & Thomas Haynes, as trustees for the said Elizabeth and
 her children. I give to my daughter Margaret Livingston, and
 her heirs a boy named Elbert, son of Phillip.

I have had beneath our mantle William Colver, formerly
sent to his heirs and assigns, the Tract & Tracts of land on which
