 appeared in open court James Wynne and Howell Hight two of the subscribing witnesses to the within last will and testament of Benjamin Green shared deceased and on oath say that they saw the deceased sign and publish the same as his last will and testament in the presence of both deponents and in the presence of Jethro Sarden the other subscribing witness thereto that deponents and the said Sarden at the request of the deceased signed the same as subscribing witnesses in the presence of the testator and of each other and that said testator was of a sound and disposing mind

 Warren County } and County being advancing age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world deem it right and proper both as respects myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property which a kind providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other heretofore made by me

I Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner my soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion I profess.

I Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Winifred Lester (free from the disposition of her future husband should she marry my little Malachi girl Keoma between four and five years old, also my pleasure carriage and my plantation wherein I now reside containing three hundred and eighty three 383 acres more or less known as the Stanback place to her and her heirs forever

I Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Virginia Habert three hundred and fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever

I Item 4th My will and desire is after paying all my just debts, that the rest of my property both real and personal wherever and whatever it may be, that it be equally divided between my son Wade the children of my deceased wife Kate Hill my daughter Winifred Lester Virginia Habert and the children of Nancy Batt to them and their heirs forever

I Item 5th I constitute and appoint my friends James Thomas and Thomas L. Lattimer Executors to this my last will and testament

a negro man Aaron to have & to hold unto the said Elizabeth Matilda for
ever in fee simple Item 4th I will and bequeath to my daughter
Louisa Sophia Thompson a negro man named Henry and a negro boy
called Moses and the following girls to wit Maria & Emily the last named
