 shortly depart from this world deem it right and proper both as respects
 myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property
 which a kind providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my last will
 and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other hertofore made by me

I item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
 Christian like manner my soul I trust shall return to rest with God
 who gave it as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and
 Savior Jesus Christ whose religion I profess.

I item 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Winifred Lester (free from
 the disposition of her future husband) should she marry my little Mulatto
 girl Neoma between four and five year old, also my pleasure carriage and
 my plantation wheron I now reside containing three hundred and eighty three
 383 and more or less known as the Stanback place to her and her heirs forever.

I item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Virginia Hobart three
 hundred and fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever.

I item 4th My will and desire is after paying all my just debts, that
 rest of my property both real and personal whenever and whatever it may
 be, that it be equally divided between my son Wade the children of my
 deceased Robt Hill my daughter Winifred Lester Virginia Hobart and the wife
 of Stanley Batt to them and their heirs forever.

I item 5th constitute and appoint my friends James Thomas and Thomas L.
 Tatimer Executors to this my last will and testament

 Matilda and her three children to wit Sonora Antonette & Jane and also
 a negro man Aaron to have & to hold unto the said Elizabeth Matilda for
 ever in fee simple Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter
 Louisa Sophia Thompson a negro man named Henry and a negro boy
 called Moses and the following girls to wit Maria & Emily the last named
