I William Love of the State of North Carolina, Hall for
Sincerely, being in perfect health of mind and body, and conscious
that I am to God, Halling unto myself the Mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament: That when
Principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into
the hand of Almighty God who gave it, and my body I recommend
to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the desire
of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And
touching such worldly estate whereunto I have given God to bestow
me in this life, I give, demise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form, first, I give unto Mary Sparbrough the Man-
sion whereon I now live, and stock of Horses & Cows, and Hogs
and Crops, and Beds, and all household furniture, Goods & Chattels
and also four hundred dollars in the hands of Richard Whiting
and Tenements, by her freely to be possessed and enjoyed. And I do
hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every
other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests, Executors, given
in any wise before or since the date hereof. And I do hereby
confirming this as my last Will and Testament.

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In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
fourth day of September, in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight
hundred and fourteen, that to wit after my death, signed, sealed,
published, pronounced and declared by the said William Love as
his last Will and Testament, in his presence, and in the presence
of each other, have hereunto subscribed our names.
